Whereas Hiram Crawford of Wright County Minnesota

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Minneapolis whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Hiram Crawford

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the West half of the North East quarter of Section seventeen and the Lot numbered three of Section eight in Township one hundred and twenty one North of Range twenty four West of the fifth principal Meridian in the District of lands formerly subject to sale at Minneapolis now Forest City Minnesota containing one hundred and twenty acres and forty eight hundredths of an acre.

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Hiram Crawford

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Hiram Crawford

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Hiram Crawford

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
