Authors Notes To the Reader

This Genealogy of the Day Family from Robert Day of Ipswich is a special library addition. This special addition only goes to the ninth generation. Four more generations now exist. The privacy of those family members still living prevents me from including them here.

This branch of the Day family to my knowledge has never been documented back to Robert before. Mr Roscoe Day of Beverly Mass has found prove of this Genealogical link. The vital stats do not show the relationship to the Robert Day family Genealogy and neither does the Church of Later Day Saints Records. The Church Records indicate that the third generation (Thomas and Elizabeth) came from Ralph Day of Dedham Massachusetts. This has been proven not to be accurate.

Documentation that ties the second generation to the third was not available at any library and neither did the wills of deceased family members provide this prove. Land transactions found at the Bureau Of Deeds Salem Massachusetts do though. This prove is located in Appendix A following this Genealogy.

This branch of the Day family left Ipswich about 1800 and went to Maine and settled in the New Sharon area. Family history shows it as Starks Maine. The family then became potato farmers about 1860 in the Caribou Maine. The family that is not documented here for reasons of privacy left Caribou about 1925 and has sense settled mainly on the North Shore area of Massachusetts.

It is known that the family in Ipswich inhabited a area today known as Pine Swamp. If fact, it is thought that part of the house is still standing towards the end of the newer section of Pine Swamp Road. As of this date July 27, 1988 the house although it is still standing is quite run down.

Old records indicate that in the early generation the Days for many years were neighbors with the Warners. On a personal note, we met their descendants while doing research.

Request from author:

If any one knows of the burial place of any of the individuals who's burial place is not documented here please contact this library and leave the documentation. Out of the family in Ipswich we can only find Aaron and his wife Sarah who are buried in the old Ipswich Burial Place. We speculate that there is a family burial place in the Pine Swamp area in Ipswich.

When the Children were young they had two Grammy Days. John said his father told him to call his mother's mother "Poverty Hill Grammy." He did and his mother spanked him! Other family notes refer to his other Day Grandmother as Pine Woods Grammy. Aaron Day from Waters History live on what used to be Poverty Hill. Jerimiah live in the area today know as Pine Swamp. Hence the name Pine Woods Grammy.

Uncle Nat and Aunt Sally lived together in Manchester, Me for a long time and brought up thier brother Aaron's daughter Harriet. She married a Freeman and lived there, and took care of them. Her mother Sally came to Maine and probably spent her last days in Manchester or Hallowell.

The following has been transcribed from Documents found in the Essex County Bureau of Deed Salem Mass. Every effort has been made to keep the document text in its original format. Spelling, grammar, etc. have not been changed to maintain the original integrity of the document. Reduced copies of the hand written originals are also attached for reference.

The following is taken from Bureau of Deeds Salem Mass. book 26 page 83.
recorded Feb. 20, 1712.

THOMAS DAY, Sr to THOMAS DAY, Jr. DEED ON RECORD FEBRUARY 20th 1712/13

To all Christian People to whom the present Deed shall come, I Thomas Day of Ipswich in the County of Essex, within the Province of ye Massachusetts Bay in New England Send Greetings. Know ye that I ye said Thomas in consideration of ye parrental Love & Affection which I bear unto my Son THOMAS DAY and yet he may have housing and land to improve for his future benifit, if GOD shall see good to spare his life and that he may be debarred for ever hereafter of claiming any furture part of my estate then herein bequethed and enabled to Do ye Duty which I expect as hereafter mentioned to the Support of my Selfe During my natural life and afford me a suitable Interment and also pay my just Debts already contracted not exceeding the sum of ninety pounds and to pay each of my Daughters Hanah & Mary Day ye Portion which I intend them which I hereby give and bequeath unto them vis Forty Pounds Apeice, Ten Pounds at the day when Hannah shall inter marry unto her & Ten Pounds unto Mary when she shall intemarry which if shall not happen that either of them shall marry before then the whole sum of Forty Pounds shall be paid to each within seven years after my decease be expired and if both or either shall recieve said Ten Pounds bequeathed at marraige, then they shall receive but thirty pounds Each, afterwards and if I give either of my Daughters or both of them any of my household goods before my deceased it shall be at a just value & to be so much abated of ye portion my said Son Thomas is to pay them at marriage all which Sum & Sum to my Said Daughter portions shall be paid in or as many if it be household goods or Neat Cattle which he hath to pay them in on yet considerations aforementioned & Ye Discharge Said Sums & Sums I have given, granted, sold, enforssed & confirmed and do by these presents give grant, sell, enforse, confirm & Deliver unto my of Said Son THOMAS DAY & his heirs & Assignees forever without any further payment all ye my Dwelling house, barn, orchards, pasture lands, meadows & Marsh Ground within ye bounds of Ipswich as in this deed hereafter excepted, that is to say My Dwelling house, barn, orchards, pasture lands, meadows & Marsh Ground within ye bounds of Ipswich as in this deed hereafter specified & all my quick Stock & utensils of husbandry (Except) what is hereafter excepted, that is to say My Dwelling house & building and Lands about them tillage pasture & meadow ground about seventy Acres be it more or less as it is bounded by Corner South East Daniel Warners Land, East by South running on ye northwest to ye corner of ye fence on ye common side & there running on a straight line from ye corner of ye fence on ye common side & there running on a straight line from ye corner through ye wood land to a black Oak standing in the fence between ye pasture & ye feild & then to a marked tree by the edge of ye meadow and so on a straight line to ye ditch in ye Swamp with all ye wood it appertenances, thereto belonging. Also I give and bequeth unto said Son Thomas, two acres of Salt Marsh Ground at ye place called ye hundreds, be it more or less lying upstream above ye acres I have given Ezekiel Day, and my lot at ye neck called Jefferies Neck & my thatch bank Lott and ye banks called Crosses Bank and my lott at Chebacco woods, with all the wood and timber on said lot, except twenty trees which I have given my Son Ezekiel provided he fetch then off within two years after ye date thus presented. Also I give my Son Thomas Day, my commonage rights and priviliges ye may accrue thereby, and also I give to my Son Thomas my Corn and Crop of Grain that I have now in ye house & Barn except three bushels of Indian Corn to Ezekiel.

The said Thomas ye parent hereby gives and grants all ye said Buildings & lands withall ye several benifits profits priviledges & appurtences unto him. The said Thomas his son to have & to hold unto him said Thomas & his heirs Exec adm & assigns forever without any lett suit or denial of him ye said parent or his heirs. Once or assigns forever alwayswith this provide that if the said Thomas his shall depart this life before his said parent be negotiated to discharge & pay the said sum of ninety pounds then is shall not with standing ye afore conveyence and bequest for ye payment of it or any part there of be in said parents power and leberty of it or any part there of given given & granted for ye discharging himselfe of such sum or sums that shall remain unpaid the said parent having upon granting of the premises reliance and dependance on his said son for his suplying of him with suitable and sufficient meat drink washing & clothing & all necessary other alterances in sickness & health provideth that if his said son shall depart this life or hath not such necessary supplies afforded him by said son or his heirs Exec or Adm & shall rather supply himself & not in his heirs family for it end ye said parent requires to himself during his natural life ye east end of his dwelling house and ye yard before before ye door & on ye north east side of ye barn & shall ye barn & five of the apple trees in ye orchard on ye east side from ye house thro the orchard to ye pasture and ye parcell of tillage and adjoining to the eastside of the ye pasture yet he reserve be it two acres more or less meadow land from the spring running to ye ridge about four acrs & ye woodland & wood upon ye ridge joining to Daniel Warners Meadow also said parent reserves of his stock two cows and two calves & six sheep to dispose of how at his pleasure & half of ye breaking up plow & my part of ye Iron bar also during my living with said son & am maintained by him my said son or his heirs shall keep me a horse for my use ye said parent having enjoyed his son to pay to his sisters each forty pounds as before expressed in this deed if said son die before said payment be made at ye times pre fix't & if he or his heirs do not make payment accordingly not withstanding ye bequest before mentioned I doe for the payment thereof hereby give & grant to my said daughters all ye upland swampy land & meadow ground from ye ridge lying next to ye land I have given my son Exekiel from one end to the other till it come to ye corner that is to say above parcel of meadow ground & upland as bounded from a marked X tree upon ye ridge of upland on ye north side of ye bridge & from ye tree on a streight line to a marked tree by it north side of ye ridge of upland on ye north side of ye bridge from a mark X tree upon ye line to a marked X tree by ye edge of ye meadow it is a boundary betwenist said Thomas my sons land & my son Ezekial land words iter her'd before signing and sealing common so=east & east & then by a marked X tree by ye edge of ye meadow on & mises I have here unto set my hand & seal this 4th Day of Jan. 1711.
Thomas Day & seal signed sealed & witnessed in the prencence of witnesses Daniel Warner Docas Warner Elis X (mark) Parker in Essex in Ipswich the 4th Day Jan 1711 Thomas Day personally appeared & acknowledged ye foregoing deed or Instrim & to be his act & deed before me Nehemiah Jewitt.

Know ye that I ye said Thomas in consideration of ye parrental Love & Affection which I bear unto my Son Ezekial DAY & that he may have lands to settle on if GOD shall see good to spare his life and that he may be debarred for ever hereafter of claiming any furture part or portion of my estate & he enabled to pay unto my Daughter Ann Lull in Rowel the wife of Simon Lull the sum of twenty & eight pounds which I Ingaged for to pay within a year after my decease or the remainder of what portion intended her out of my estate & gave a writing under my hand on thier marriage if it should be paid if not by myself before my death then by my heirs as is mentioned on so consideration & discharge of said sum I doe by said present for myself & my heirs- Acquit said Ezekial & his heirs & assign from any further paiment for what lands and stock I ye herin have or doe bequeathed him & by these present I doe hereby give grant enbeoffe confirene & deliver & by these present I have given granted sold enfeoffed confirmed & dehiered in my son Ezekiel & his heirs Ecee Thomas & assign for ever certain parcells of upland ground meadow & marsh grounds of Ipswich afore said. Namely about twenty acreas be it more or less of upland & meadow ground which joyneth to ye land which I have given to his brother Thomas at Westerly corner on top of an hill at a Rock in the fence running thence Southwesterly to a black oake tree at the corner of my land thence running south easterly to an old stump with a stake in it or by it at the corner of Wallis his Meadow ground then the line runing by Wallis Meadow Easterly to my other land to a birch & then cross the meadow by said Wallis & my land to a hemlock tree mark A thence running south-east till it come to my son Thomas his land at a ditch & then bounded by the ditch to Thomas his brothers land & then to the first mentioned boundary also about one acre of salt marsh in the hundreds so called below the narrows where Rowley River ??? the creek called Lords Creek doe almost meet bounded by John Adams his Marsh at the lower end of said river on one side & on the other side by Lord Creak I also give him one cow two calves & twenty timber trees on my lot in chebacco woods provided he fetch then off said land lot within two years next after the date hereof having given said lot all but said trees to my son Thomas all the said lands & marsh ground with all ye priviledges benifits & profits & appurtenaces belonging to have & to hold unto him ye said Ezekial & his heirs Exee & assign forever without any let suit or Deniall of me my heirs Exee Thomas for assign forever provided he pay said sum of twenty & eight pounds unto his brother & sister Lull or their heirs at or before ye time specified which if he or his heirs do not discharge & pay according to my engagement unto them thence I give to my daughter & her heirs to have and to hold for ever a part of the afores land being about four acres of woodland upon the hill which land the joyns to my son Thomas his land that I have given him on the south side & to the land of said Ezekial on the other side & one end which land shall be them & their heirs for ever & my said son & the rest of my heirs discharged from engagement to them also I give unto my son Ezekial my halfe of my breaking up plow my part of ye iron bar the other halfe of each belonging to my son Thomas// The words blotted out about the thirddiet line before signing & sealing.
