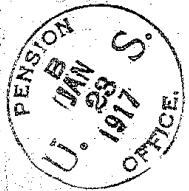

BUREAU OF PENSIONS
WASHINGTON, D. C.

Madam:

The first section of the Act of Congress, approved by the President September 8, 1916, reads as follows:

" * * * That from and after the passage of this Act the rate of pension for a widow, now on the roll or hereafter to be placed on the pension roll and entitled to receive a less rate than hereinafter provided, who was the lawful wife of any officer or enlisted man in the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States, during the period of his service in the Civil War, shall be twenty dollars per month, and the rate of pension for a widow of an officer or enlisted man of the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States who served in the Civil War, the War with Mexico, or the War of 1812, now on the roll or hereafter to be placed on the pension roll and entitled to receive a less rate than hereafter provided, who has reached or shall hereafter reach the age of seventy years, shall be twenty dollars per month; * * * "

If you are pensioned as the widow of a soldier, sailor, or marine, who served in the Civil War, the War with Mexico, or the War of 1812, and if you have reached the age of seventy years, you should fill out the blank on the back of this communication and return same to the Commissioner of Pensions, Washington, D. C., being careful to state correctly your pension certificate number, the name and service of the soldier, sailor, or marine, the exact date of your birth, the place of your birth, your name as it appears in your pension certificate, and your present postoffice address in full.

If the evidence in your pension case shows that you are entitled to the increase of pension provided by this legislation, the Bureau will, as soon as possible, grant the increase. If further evidence be necessary, a call for same will issue.

No claim agent or attorney will be recognized in connection with this matter.

INSTRUCTIONS TO REGISTRAR—The registered name may be inserted in space above, if desired, for convenience. It is recommended, however, that the name be entered only on face of certificate, in space at upper right-hand corner. It should be immediately upon receipt at your office, and a copy of filing in your office and your signature there should be entered at the same time on the reverse of the certificate in the lower right-hand corner. Examine the certificate carefully before making the permit and call the attention of the undertaker or person in charge of the disposition of the body to any omissions. If any item cannot be obtained, it should not be left blank nor a meaningless word used, but the word "Unknown" should be written. Be particularly careful to see that the cause of death is correctly stated. If out of your office, do not register it, but see that it is filed with the registrar where the death occurred. It is necessary to give the "Special Information," except in institutions, etc.

Fail to mail all certificates of death filed with the Secretary of the State Board of Health, St. Paul, on the fifth (5th) day of the following month.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SUBREGISTRARS—Licensed persons, when duly authorized by the State Board of Health to act as subregistrars, may issue permits to bury or remove the body in villages or townships (but not in cities). They must have the certificates filled out in ink, and must present all certificates with the registrars on or before the third day of the following month without exception. Certificates should not be numbered by the subregistrars, but by the registrars who record and file them.

DUTY OF UNDERTAKER—It is the duty of the undertaker or other person in charge of the final disposition of a human body to observe the following regulations of the registration law: 1. He must obtain a certificate of death and have it filled out with all of the personal and statistical information required by law. This part of the certificate should preferably be signed by a relative or the decedent, or by some competent person acquainted with the facts. It may be signed by the undertaker or by the physician if desired. 2. The certificate containing the above personal information must now be presented to the attending physician for the medical certificate of cause of death. If the physician is absent, so that the medical certificate cannot be promptly obtained, the incomplete certificate should be then presented to the registrar with a statement of that fact. The registrar may thereupon issue a conditional permit, provided the certificate be completed at the earliest opportunity. But registrars will exercise especial care in granting such conditional permits to interment, and will not issue them in cases where the death did not result from any infectious disease, or from any sanitary precautions, or from any suspicious means. If any doubt exists as to the cause of a death without medical attendance, the registrar will refer the certificate to the Health Officer for investigation and statement of fact.

The undertaker or person in charge of the disposition of the body must next present the complete certificate of death, containing the medical certificate of cause of death, to the Registrar of the township, city or village where the death occurred, and obtain a permit for the burial or removal of the body before it is made of it.

4. The undertaker should deliver the Registrar's Burial Permit to the sexton when the interment is made, or, if the body is removed by rail or boat, the Registrar's Removal Permit must be delivered by him to the agent of the transportation company, who must attach it to the box containing the body to accompany it to destination.

DUTY OF SEXTON—Sextons must not permit an interment until a properly prepared Burial or Removal Permit is delivered by the undertaker or person in charge of the remains. A Removal Permit answers the purpose of a Burial Permit, unless there are local regulations to the contrary.

SUGGESTIONS TO PHYSICIANS—Physicians are earnestly requested to facilitate the execution of the law, and especially so far as it may be in their power to aid undertakers in their duty of promptly obtaining a statement of cause of death. Blank certificates will be supplied to all physicians in the State upon request, and may be obtained at any time from the local registrars. Physicians should have a supply of blanks on hand, and in the event of death, kindly leave the medical certificate of cause of death with the family of the decedent, or have it ready for the undertaker so that he will not be delayed in obtaining the permit. Compliance with this request, which will remove one of the principal difficulties of prompt registration, will be greatly appreciated.

The statement of cause of death is very important for many reasons. Please be precise and definite in making out the medical certificate. If the death occurred from cancer or tuberculosis, state what part of the body was affected. If from septicemia, give the cause of the septicemia, especially for females of child-bearing age. Never report a death from "heart failure"; it is universally discredited as a statement of cause of death. If such a death was due to actual heart disease, state that fact; or if the "heart failure" occurred in the course of diphtheria or other disease, give the name of the disease that caused the "heart failure."

LAW.

The registration of deaths in Minnesota is governed by Chapter 464, Laws of 1907. Copies of the law and blank certificates of death will be supplied by the Secretary of the State Board of Health, upon request.

AN ACT

GRANTING PENSIONS TO CERTAIN ENLISTED MEN, SOLDIERS, AND OFFICERS WHO SERVED IN THE CIVIL WAR AND THE WAR WITH MEXICO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled:

That any person who served ninety days or more in the military or naval service of the United States during the late civil war, or sixty days in the war with Mexico, and who has been honorably discharged therefrom, and who has reached the age of sixty-two years or over, shall, upon making proof of such facts, according to such rules and regulations as the Secretary of the Interior may provide, be placed upon the pension roll, and be entitled to receive a pension as follows: In case such person has reached the age of sixty-two years, twelve dollars per month; seventy years, fifteen dollars per month; seventy-five years or over, twenty dollars per month; and such pension shall commence from the date of the filing of the application in the Bureau of Pensions after the passage and approval of this Act: **Provided**, that pensioners who are sixty-two years of age or over, and who are now receiving pensions under existing laws, or whose claims are pending in the Bureau of Pensions, may, by application to the Commissioner of Pensions, in such form as he may prescribe, receive the benefits of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent any pensioner or person entitled to a pension from prosecuting his claim and receiving a pension under any other general or special act: **Provided**, that no person shall receive a pension under any other law at the same time or for the same period that he is receiving a pension under the provisions of this Act: **Provided**, further, that no person who is now receiving or shall hereafter receive a greater pension under any other general or special law than he would be entitled to receive under the provisions herein shall be pensionable under this Act.

- Sec. 2. That rank in the service shall not be considered in applications filed hereunder.
- Sec. 3. That no pension attorney, claim agent, or other person shall be entitled to receive any compensation for services rendered in presenting any claim to the Bureau of Pensions, or securing any pension, under this Act.

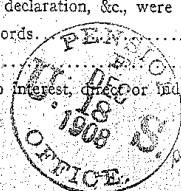

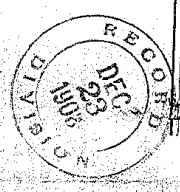
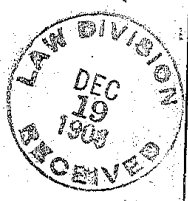

AN ACT.

To increase the pension of widows, minor children, and so forth, of deceased soldiers and sailors of the late civil war, the war with Mexico, the various Indian wars, and so forth, and to grant a pension to certain widows of the deceased soldiers and sailors of the late civil war.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That from and after the passage of this Act the rate of pension for widows, minor children under the age of sixteen years, and helpless minors as defined by existing laws, now on the roll or hereafter to be placed on the pension roll and entitled to receive a less rate than hereinafter provided, shall be twelve dollars per month; and nothing herein shall be construed to affect the existing allowance of two dollars per month for each child under the age of sixteen years and for each helpless child; and all Acts or parts of Acts, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed: *Provided, however,* That this Act shall not be so construed as to reduce any pension under any Act, public or private.

SEC. 2. That if any officer or enlisted man who served ninety days or more in the Army or Navy of the United States during the late civil war, and who has been honorably discharged therefrom, has died, or shall hereafter die, leaving a widow, such widow shall, upon due proof of her husband's death, without proving his death to be the result of his army or navy service, be placed on the pension roll from the date of the filing of her application therefor under this Act at the rate of twelve dollars per month, ~~having her widowhood~~, provided that said widow shall have married said soldier or sailor prior to June twenty-seventh, eighteen hundred and ninety; and the benefits of this section shall include those widows whose husbands, if living, would have a pensionable status under the Joint Resolutions of February fifteenth, eighteen hundred and ninety-five; July first, nineteen hundred and two, and June twenty-eighth, nineteen hundred and six.

SEC. 3. That no claim agent or attorney shall be recognized in the adjudication of claims under the first section of this Act, and that no agent, attorney, or other person engaged in preparing, presenting, or prosecuting any claim under the provisions of the second section of this Act shall, directly or indirectly, contract for, demand, receive, or retain for such services in preparing, presenting, or prosecuting such claim a sum greater than ten dollars, which sum shall be payable only upon the order of the Commissioner of Pensions by the pension agent making payment of the pension allowed; and any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this section, or who shall wrongfully withhold from the pensioner or claimant the whole or any part of a pension or claim allowed or due such pensioner or claimant under this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall, for each and every such offense, be fined not exceeding five hundred dollars or be imprisoned at hard labor not exceeding two years, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Approved April 19, 1908.

THE BENEFITS OF THE LAW.

CIVIL WAR.—Widows are entitled to pension of \$12 per month, from date of filing application under this new law, without regard to amount of property or income, but must have been married to the soldier or sailor before June 27, 1890. APPLICATION NECESSARY under section 2 of the Act.

Widows of beneficiaries of the joint resolution of February 15, 1895, (Missouri State Militia and Provisional Missouri Militia), the joint resolution of July 1, 1902, ("U. S. Volunteers"), and the joint resolution of June 28, 1906, (deserted, dishonorably discharged or dismissed from a prior enlistment) are entitled to the benefits of the law.

At least ninety days' service and an honorable discharge of soldier or sailor are still required.

Widows already pensioned at less than \$12, exclusive of allowance on account of children, are entitled to an increase to \$12 per month from April 19, 1908, with the additional allowance of \$2 per month for each child of the soldier under the age of sixteen. NO APPLICATION NECESSARY.

Minor children under sixteen and helpless children, now or hereafter pensioned in their own right, will also be entitled to the \$12 rate from April 19, 1908, with the \$2 additional per month for each child.

MEXICAN WAR—INDIAN WARS—SPANISH AND PHILIPPINE WARS—REGULAR ESTABLISHMENT. Widow's pension title remains as defined by existing laws. Rate of pension increased to \$12 per month from April 19, 1908, with \$2 additional per month for each child of the soldier or sailor (service since March 4, 1861) under sixteen.

Sec. 4745.—Any pledge, mortgage, sale, assignment, or transfer of any right, claim, or interest in any pension which has been, or may hereafter be granted, shall be void and of no effect, and any person who shall, pledge or receive as a pledge, mortgage, sale, assignment or transfer of any right, claim, or interest in any pension, or pension certificate which has been, or may hereafter be granted or issued, or who shall hold the same as collateral security for any debt, or promise, or upon any pretext of such security, or promise, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars and the costs of the prosecution; and any person who shall retain the certificate of a pensioner and refuse to surrender the same upon the demand of the Commissioner of Pensions, or a United States pension agent, or any other person, authorized by the Commissioner of Pensions, or the pensioner, to receive the same shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars and the costs of the prosecution.
