I John Day of Ipswich in the County of Essex in New England being  
of sound mind yet of sound understanding & Memory doe Make this  
my will & Testament in forme & Manner following: I mpe I  
bequeath My soul into the hands of God who gave me it: & my body  
I Comitt to the dust by a decent burial In hopes of a happy Resurrection  
through the power & Merit of my dear Redeemer My Lord & Saviour  
Jesus Christ: And for what estate God hath graciously given me I  
give & bequeath the same as followeth: after my debts are paid  
To My dear & beloved wife: I give & give of half my now dwelling  
house during her naturall life of her good to live in it: & also give  
my house hold stuff & Crock stock to be to my wife her use to pay my  
debts with & to pay out of it to each of my daughters as she shall  
think best as they shall come of age, off twenty years or day of Marriage  
each being to have an Equall part: but if she see good to keep any  
part of such estate longer in her hands: then she to dispose of it to  
them afterward Equally: also I give to my wife the use of such  
houseing lands & Meadows which I have hereafter bequeathed to  
my son Moses untill he come to the age of twenty & one year  
the Rest of My Lands not particularly given to each of my sons I leave  
it as the more ables with my wife to be disposed of to our daughters  
whether it be Lands in possession or in Reversion: & the keeping of two Cowd  
yearly John & a yearly payment to be made by each to their mother: & the keeping  
of six sheep by Moses: & the oxen of six year yearly: also yearly paym<sup>t</sup>s if she require it  
H. To my eldest son John Day I give & bequeath my now dwelling house  
barne Orchard out house with all privileges & Appurtenances w<sup>ch</sup> all the  
Land about it is my Father gave me & the Land I purchast of the  
Towne: & half my six Acre Lot of Marsh w<sup>ch</sup> my Father gave me to be  
divided from my wifes land to Sam<sup>l</sup> Chappmans Marsh the Inds to Lye & each  
may have benefit of a high way he & his Brother being Equally divided  
In. to have his choise: also I give to John all the six Acre of Marsh  
& thatch bank which I bought of phillep Fowler: lying on both sides of Crock  
Cald paimis Creek: also I give to my son John the Marsh mortgaged  
to mee by bro<sup>r</sup> Moses penyng if he doe not redime it: or if he doe then  
I give my son John the pay that he redemes it w<sup>ch</sup>: also I give him half  
my Ornsels of husbandry: at which he is to have only the part of the  
house reserved before for his Mother: & to pay to his Mother three pound  
yearly in Malt wheate or pork or such Come as passeth to buy things w<sup>ch</sup>  
of Merchants: & paym<sup>t</sup>s to his sister Mshitable with in four years after  
my decease the sum of forty pounds in Come & Cattle: & to his  
sister Hamah at age of twenty y<sup>r</sup>s or day of Marriage the sum of twenty & two pound  
& to his mother a barrele of rydar & five bushels of Apples yearly if she require it.  
H. After my son Moses comes to Age of twenty & one years as followeth  
To my son Moses I give My house & Land & barne & Orchard w<sup>ch</sup> the  
Land about them Joyned upon Sam<sup>l</sup> Perkins his Land & privileges  
thereto belonging: also three acres of w<sup>ch</sup> land in the Conon field which my  
Father day gave me: also six Acres of w<sup>ch</sup> land which I bought of phillep  
Fowler ~~and~~ one Acre of Sam<sup>l</sup> Bishops: also six Acres of w<sup>ch</sup> land I bought  
of William Fortin: also the other half of the six Acre of salt Marsh  
which was my Fathers: also six Acres of salt Marsh which I had of  
bro<sup>r</sup> John penyng: also the other half of my Ornsels of husbandry  
the son Moses living to age: he is upon the w<sup>ch</sup> of what I have given  
him to keep his mother yearly six sheep: & to pay her fifty shillings  
yearly during her naturall life in like sort his brother is to pay  
if she require it. & one barrele of rydar & five bushels of Apples yearly

to pay to Lydia his sister: w<sup>th</sup> in four years after he Comes of age in Come & Take the sum of forty pounds: & to Hamnah his sister within four years after she Comes of age of Twenty years or day of Marriage the sum of Eighteen pounds in like specie:

¶ I give to my Eldest daughter Mehitabel the sum of forty pounds which her Br<sup>o</sup> Jn<sup>o</sup> is to pay: & also one third part of such Estate left in My wifes hand according as she shall see good to spare it for her before or at her death

¶ I give to my daughter Lydia a sum of forty pounds to be paid by Moses within four years after he Comes of age: & also one third part of such Estate left in my wifes hand according as she shall see good to spare it for her before or at her death

¶ I give to my daughter Hamnah a sum of Twenty & two pounds to be paid by John her Br<sup>o</sup>: at a age of Twenty y<sup>rs</sup> or day of Marriage: & Eighteen pounds to be paid by Moses to be paid within four years after she Comes of age of Twenty years or day of Marriage: & one third part of such Estate left in my wifes hand according as she shall see good to spare it for her before or at her death

¶ I give Jn<sup>o</sup> My Maggitt my other gun & sword & bandeleers to Moses: it is my Musquet & other things belonging to it: & my cloathes or wearing apparell equally betwixt them: & such books as I have

¶ My will is that if my son Moses depart this life before age of twenty one y<sup>rs</sup> that his brother if living shall Inherit his part doing his duty as to paym<sup>ts</sup> to his Mother & Sisters: & pay to each sister if living or the heirs of their bodies lawfully begott a fifth of the value of such Housing Lands & Meadows bequeathed him: or in default thereof: they shall each have such shares in the Inheritance.

¶ My will is that if any of my daughters depart this life before the time appointed for the receiving their portions then my Eldest son shall have double part in such Legacy or Legacies & the Rest of Survivors Equal parts

¶ My will is that My two Sons provide their Mother during her widow hood sutable firewood yearly each a like quantity: & if each son which my sd wife shall live with from time to time take care to keep a horse for to carry their mother to Meeting: & each pay her yearly three pounds of tax

¶ My will is & I hereby constitute & Appoynt my beloved wife Sarah my sole Executrix to this my last will & Testament to aske receive all debts to pay all debts In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this thirtieth of July Anno. Dom: Sixtine hundred & Eighty & nine
