Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of Instructions.

Upon examination we find the following objective conditions: Pulse rate, 60; respiration, 18; temperature, normal; height, 5 feet 10 1/2 inches; weight, 150 pounds; age, 53 years. The left shoulder, left elbow and right knee & right hip pro-pitala markedly on motion and alleged painful also much pain on movement in lumbar and coxo-iliac joints, Hoops & ribs with apparent difficulty, otherwise all muscles, joints & tendons are normal. The heart on per-cu-tan-ous palpation appears to palpation & inspection, heart is normal as to size, position & valv. sounds, no cyanosis, redness or dyspnoea, standing pulse 64 on expiration 70 p. minute. Tongue coated, skin normal, body fair, well nourished, alleges gastric somnolence, some gaseous distention Liver and Spleen normal as to size, Riclat examination shows rectum irritable, humanoidal, veins enlarged but no distinct pile tumour present, no fissure, fistula or ulceration. Hands colorless, muscles large but soft, no arcs, no arteries. Prostate gland enlarged some alleged sensitive to pressure. There is a double oblique inguinal hernia. Neither come through the external ring, they begin the canal & are the size of an English walnut, left rings the size of a dime. Reducible, retainable but not retained. Piles as above, there is a chronic naso-pharyngeal catarrh. No evidence of vicious habits. Trachea & all other organs are normal. No other disability is found to exist. For rheumatism 1/18, For dis. of heart no rating, For Chr. diarrhoea no rating, For general debility, no rating, For double rupture, neither of which come through the external ring 1/8, For piles 3/8, For Catarh 4/18, additional Surg. at rest 33 Dis. p. 35 Exp. 30 miles Surg. are normal. Carnid. p. 1020, acid, no sugar, no albumin.

The actual or probable origin of every existing disability must be fully set forth. Whenever a disability is shown, or is believed to be due to or aggravated by vicious habits the opinion of the board must be stated. When not due to such habits this fact must be stated.

Each disability must be rated separately, the act of Congress of March 3, 1883, requiring "that the report of such examining surgeons shall specifically state the rating which, in their judgment, the applicant is entitled to."

At the time when he became acquainted with the said Day he was suffering from diarrhea, which he claimed was of army origin, and he complained a great deal of pain in his bowels and in his groins, and he was suffering also from catarah. This deponent has been well acquainted with the said Nathaniel Day from 1867 until the present time; he has worked with him at teaming and farming and for a while the said Day lived in his (deponent's) family. These disabilities above named have existed during all the period of deponent's acquaintance with him, varying in intensity, some times better and some times worse, and as deponent understands, during the greater part of said time the said Day has suffered with piles. This deponent cannot swear positively that said Nathaniel Day has had double inguinal hernia, but he does know that he has complained of pains in both of his groins during this period.

Deponent is forty-nine (49) years of age and has lived in Hennepin County ever since the year 1854.

The said Nathaniel Day is to deponent's personal knowledge a man of good character, temperate in his habits, sober, peaceable and industrious, and no one of these disabilities above named was ever caused or aggravated by the vicious habits of said Day. And in deponent's judgment the disabilities above named are permanent in character.

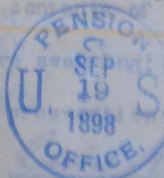

On this 12th day of September, A.D.1898, personally came before me, a Notary Public within and for said County and State, Isabel D. Libby, aged 58 years, who, being by me duly sworn according to law, states with reference to the pension claim of Nathaniel Day No. 1027951 that she has been acquainted with said Nathaniel Day for more than forty years, and that she knew him at the time that he came out of the United States army in 1865. That she always understood that he ~~suffered~~ served as a Private Company L, 1st Maine Cavalry, and in Company G, 1st D. C. Cavalry. When he returned from the army in the summer of 1865 he was somewhat debilitated in health and was suffering from chronic diarrhea catarrh and complained of pains in his groins. He was unable to do any work for the first year after he came out of the service. He has suffered continuously from these disabilities from 1865 until the present time. I don't know from my own personal knowledge that he has double inguinal hernia because I never made an examination, but I do know that he has complained of pains in his groins and I always suspected that that was the disability from which he was suffering. His catarrh has been variable; sometimes better, and sometimes worse, but the above named disabilities have continuously existed from 1865 to the present time.

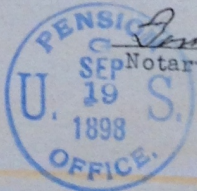
