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In the name of God Amen: The eleventh day of August one thousand six hundred eighty & three: I Robert day of Ipswich in the County of Essex Brickmaker having yet by the good provident of god to me, my understanding will: but being aged & full of infirmities know not how suddenly the Lord may call me out of this world. do make & ordaine this my last will & testament in maner and forme following: That is to say: first I comend my soule into the hands of god my maker hoping assuredly through the only merits of Iesus christ my saviour to be made partakers of life everlasting: & I comend my body to the earth in hope of a glorious resurrection.

I give to my son John day after my decease, as already I have engaged upon his manage with sary poney my dwelling house with the barn out houses orchards yards & land about it with all the appurtenances & privileges therunto belonging: also all my salt marsh adjoining to the hundred & all the parcel of land by my near the more orles wh. I bought of deacon Knolton: all which I give to my son John day to have and to hold to him & his heirs for ever: with this proviso & condition: if he pay twenty pounds or else leave the lot of I bought of deacon Knolton: whom I shall despoil of it: according to agreement at my son John his marriage, wh. twenty pound shall be paid the one halfe in good New England money the other ten pound in good wheat malt & pocke of eath proportionally or leave the aforesaid lot: also I give my son John one booke.

I give to my son Thomas day my farms in wh. he now lieth containing fifty four acres be it more orles: with these provisos & conditions following: first that he or sow & take off the crop & if mowing & carrying away too loads of hay yearly from yeare to yeare during the whole tirm of my naturall life: secondly that my son Thomas pay by way of legacy twenty pounds: ten pound to my daughter Hannah lord & ten pound to my daughter sary fiske with in three years after my decease as is expressed in my deed of gift to him & so Thomas also I give him one booke.

to my daughter Hannah lord I have already given thirty five pounds: I also now give her ten pound more to be paid by my son Thomas day as is above expressed: also I give her fifteen pounds more to be paid by my son James wh. shall be paid her with the bed in the parlour & bedstead & furniture belonging to it at a price the rest of the legacy in other pay: also I give her one booke.

to my daughter sary fiske I have already given thirty five pounds: I likewise give her ten pounds more to be paid by my son Thomas day as is above expressed also I give her fifteen pounds more to be paid by my son James in such good pay as he hath in his possession: also I give her one booke.

I do appoint & ordaine my son James day to be my sole executours of this my last will & testament to him I give all the rest of my estate of lands & cattle & goods of all sorts what so ever & debts from whom so ever due unto him & his heirs for ever in confirmation whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this eleventh day of August one thousand six hundred eighty & three.
