I Thomas Day of Ipswich in the County of Essex within the
Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England Land greeting
Know ye that I Thomas Day for Consideration of that particular
Love & affection which I bear to my son Ezekiel Day &
that he may & have Lands to settle on if God shall spare
his life: & that he may & Debarr forever hereafter of
claineing any further part or portion of my Estate
& be enabled & forever to pay unto my Daughter Ann
Lull in Rowley the wife of Simon Lull the sum of twenty
& eight pounds which I engaged for to pay within a
year after my Decease as the remainder of what portion
I intended ^{her} out of my Estate & gave a writing under
my hand on her Marriage if it should be paid if not
by myself before my Death then by my Heirs as is Men-
tioned on so Considerations & the Discharge of said sum
I Doe by said presents for myself & my Heirs Acquit said
Ezekiel & his Heirs & assignes from any further claim
for what Lands and Stock I herein have or Doe bequeath
unto him & by these presents I Doe hereby give grant

Enfeoffe Confirme & Deliver & by these presents I have
given granted sold Enfeoffed Confirmed & Delivered unto
my said son Ezekiel & his heirs Exec^t Tom^r & Apigns
for ever certaine parcels of upland ground Meadow
& marsh ground situate lying & being in the bounds
of Ipswich aforesaid. Named about twenty acres be it
more or less of upland & meadow ground which foyeth
to land which I have given to his brother Thomas at the
Westerly corner on the top of an hill abt a Rock in the
fence running thence southwesterly to black Oak tree
at the corner of my land hence running south east
to an old stump with a stake in it or by it at the
corner of his Wallis his meadow ground & then the
line running by Wallis meadow Easterly to my other
land to abtch & then to the meadow by said Wallis
& my land to hemlock tree markt & thence running
south east till it come to my son Thomas his land at a
ditch & then bounded by the ditch to Thomas his
brothers land & then to the first mentioned boundary
abt one acre of salt marsh in the hundreds
so called belon the Marrows where Rowley River &
the Creek called Lords Creek doe almost meet bounde
by John Adams his marsh at the lower end & said
River on one side & the other side by Lords Creek
I also to give him one cow two Calves & twenty timber
trees on my lot in Cheacco woods provided he fetches
off within said lot within two years next after the date
hereof herring given said lot all but said trees to my
son Thomas all the said lands & marsh ground
with all & priviledges benefits & profits & appurtenances
belonging to have & to hold unto him & said Ezekiel
& his heirs Exec^t Tom^r & Apigns for ever without any let
suit or Deniall of me my heirs Exec^t Tom^r & Apigns
for ever provided he pay said sum of twenty eight
pounds unto his brother & sister Lull or their heirs
at or before 6 time specified which if he or his heirs do not
Discharge & pay according to my engagement unto them
then I to give to my daughter & her heirs to have &
to hold for ever a part of the aforesaid land being about
four acres of woodland upon the hill which land adjoyns
to my son Thomas his land that I have given him on
the south side & to the land of said Ezekiel on the

other side lone end which land shall be to them to their

of sum of ten pound money to me paid in hand by my self
Mary Wainwright of Ravelhill & receipt of same being to my full
satisfaction & witness I say John Hartshorne in my behalf & by
virtue of good legal & full power from my son John Hartshorne man
of Norwich by letter of attorney in his behalf my son John Hartshorne
towards this wherein I say John Hartshorne have assigned & sold
unto my self Mary Wainwright a certain piece of land in Ravelhill
extening about Sixty rods of land to it more or less & bounded
as followeth and to begin at of outermost corner next of high way
by of corner of of now Shaping stone wall near of Meeting house
from thence easterly through over a Pear Tree stamp to a walnut
tree next enthr land now John Johnsons down next equal with
his barn and to wheel around on a south west as of fence now dock
said bearing from of outermost Stake of of fence a stringer
line to of corner of of wall first named bounded on the
southern Eastward on P. Johnsons land westward as said
out of bounds common to her said Mary Wainwright
