

Dr. Simpson Buried Here

Dr. M.G. Simpson, for many years a resident of Fonda, but more recently located at Faribault, Minnesota, died Thursday, January _____ caused by a tumor on the brain.

Dr. Simpson was well known in and around Fonda, where he resided for more than twenty years, departing from here about six years ago. He was born at Hopkinton, St. Lawrence Ccounty, New York, June _____ (looks like 39)

1850, and came west while still a young man. He came to Fonda to locate, twenty-six years ago last November. He was twice married. His first wife who was well known here, being Miss Sophia _____ tting, who died in June 1917. His second wife survived him. He left here for Minnesota six years ago and located in business at Faribault Minnesolta, where he _____ (probably "lived until" the hour of his death. He leaves two sons, Claude Simpson, of Terrieth Town, and Frank Simpson of St. Paul, Minnesota. The latter accompanied the remains to Fonda, where they were laid at final rest in Cedar Cemetery on Monday, the funeral taking place from L.R. Wright's undertaking establishment at 2:30 that afternoon. Dr. Simpson was a genial companion in his Fonda Days, and pleasant memories remain of him with his old friends.

Frank Simpson, who spent his boyhood days in Fonda, but who is now a resident of St. Paul Minnesota, where he is employed as superintendent of The Twin City egg and poultry house, visited with a number of old friends Monday, returning that evening. He accompanied the remains of his father here for burial.
