 parcel or tract of land lying & being in Boothbay in the
 Crooked River so called to w^r, beginning at a spruce ^{tree} marked on
 four sides adjoining Solomon Parkham's land, & runs by
 the River side eighty rods, thence running N.B.S. thence
 running N.B.E. eighty poles, thence running E.B.S. to the
 River, thence southerly along the shore of said River to the
 first mentioned bounds, containing sixty acres, it being
